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### **Education and Community Outreach Student Fellowship**

Reconsidered Goods (RG) is a nonprofit creative reuse center that promotes environmental awareness, community engagement, and creative expression through reuse, education, and the arts. RG challenges our community to reconsider how we understand art, artmaking, and our own creative potential. RG is a resource for the reusable and welcomes people of all ages, backgrounds, interests, and abilities to learn more about resource conservation.

The Reconsidered Goods Education and Community Outreach Student Fellowship is a competitive, paid temporary position that advances leadership skills through mentoring, experimentation, hands-on learning, program development, and practical experience. This unique program will provide a current undergrad or graduate student with the opportunity to assist with the operations of a non-profit organization through learning experiences within our art education program and community outreach partnerships. Students are expected to participate in daily activities, contribute skills and ideas in planning sessions, and become an integral part of RG's creative programming team. The fellowship will prepare students as future leaders in the arts, nonprofit sector, social entrepreneurship, or education fields.

The RG Education and Community Outreach Student Fellow will work alongside Shayla Doyal, Education and Community Engagement Manager, and Catena Bergevin, Executive Director, to help plan, facilitate, and evaluate education and outreach programs that will increase our community impact. The fellowship will assist in expanding our outreach and advocacy efforts to establish new partnerships with other nonprofits, educational institutions, and community organizations. The student fellow will prioritize RG's commitment to diversity equity, inclusion, and accessibility and assist in expanding our impact to neighborhoods and communities we have not historically participated in.

- Be an undergraduate or graduate student in a local university or college
- Have experience and interest in working with children of all ages and abilities
- Have experience and interest in the arts and/or environmental sustainability as it applies to lifelong learning and wellbeing for children, teens, adults, and older adults
- Must be technically savvy, basic computer skills are a must including proficiency in Microsoft Office
- Possess strong organizational and communication skills
- Ability to prioritize and manage projects efficiently
- Comfortable working independently as well as in a team environment on a variety of projects
- Available for full time work (32 hours week) variable schedule will include weekdays and weekends
- Summer availability (May – August 2024) (480 total hours)
- Bilingual (plus but not required)
